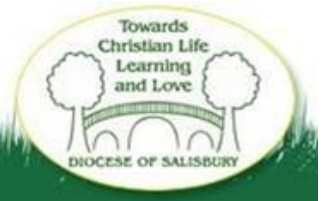

Thank you for your continued support with making sure your child attends school. Our current attendance level is 96.5%- this is great and I would love for it to stay that way or be even higher for the last term!

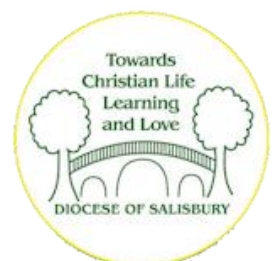
Remember to let the office know by 9.30 on the day if your child is absent. Please try to keep medical appointments out of school hours.

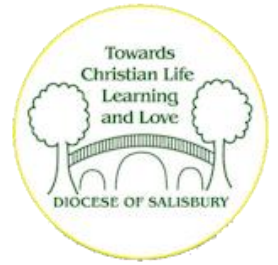
Thank you to those of you who enjoyed tea and cake at our display afternoon before half term- we raised over £100! This money will be going towards new gym mats.

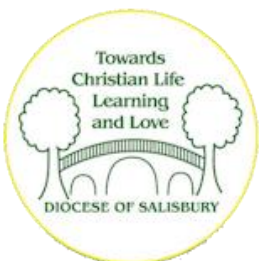

## INTERNET SAFETY TIPS FOR PARENTS

<b>1</b> Don't block all access to technology. Help your child learn to use tech <b>safely</b> and <b>positively</b> .	<b>2</b> Take an <b>interest</b> in your child's favourite apps or sites. Co-view or co-create at times.
<b>3</b> Be the parent. You're in charge. Set <b>boundaries</b> and consider using filtering software.	<b>4</b> Create a family media <b>agreement</b> with tech free zones such as cars, bedrooms, and meals.
<b>5</b> Teach your child what <b>personal information</b> they should not reveal online (YAPPY acronym).	<b>6</b> Help your child learn to <b>filter</b> information online and navigate fact from fiction.
<b>7</b> Navigate digital <b>dilemmas</b> with your child. Avoid using devices as rewards or punishments.	<b>8</b> <b>Balance</b> green time and screen time at home. Focus on basic developmental needs.
<b>9</b> Don't support your child to sign up for sites with <b>age restrictions</b> (e.g. 13+) if they're underage.	<b>10</b> <b>Learn more:</b> Explore reliable resources for parents so you can educate yourself.
