Our current attendance figure is that as a whole school we reached 97.1% attendance this term-thank you for all your support with this.




#### PTA



Salterton class went to Goldophin School where they listened to a talk by the author Phil Earle- he writes books linked to the Second World War








# Sporting Festivals ....
