Literacy

We are learning to:

- predict and join in with a pattern in a rhyme, poem or traditional story
- Begin to discriminate the initial sound in a word
- Begin to link a sound with a letter shape and begin to write the letter shape
- To begin to recognise tricky words like the, and, to, the, I, no, go.
- To begin to understand that print and writing carry meaning
- give meaning to their drawings and mark making.
- To begin to make up their own stories in their play

Physical Development

We are learning to:

- Experiment with different ways of moving and travelling
- -To strengthen large body movements to develop balance and co-ordination
- to explore sequences and patterns of movement
- Be able to negotiate space when playing with other children, adjusting speed or changing direction.
- To develop fine motor skills to enable them to use a range of tools
- Draw lines, circles and across the body movements using gross motor movements to mirror writing patterns .
- to be encouraged to be independent in putting on and off coats, shoes and wellies.

Expressive Arts & Design

We are learning to:

- Join in with dancing and ring games and learning new songs and dances.
- Explore the different sounds of instruments.
- Explore colour and mixing colours using different types of paint.
- to explore how different media can be combined to create an affect.
- To learn how to be able to select resources and tools needed to shape, assemble and join materials.
- Engage in imaginative role-play based on own first-hand experiences and stories.
- To use different media to symbolise and represent their own fascinations and schemas.
- -To begin to collaborate with others and share ideas to extend play.

Maths

We are learning to:

- To begin to explore pattern and develop language associated with pattern i.e. repeat, step, cyclical also linking pattern to routines e.g. daily timetable, week, seasons, home routines
- -To be able to recognise differences when sorting and matching i.e tidying up, coats and shoes
- -to make comparisons i.e. more/less/same when comparing amounts of things.
- -To explore the vocabulary of Time and what it means i.e. recorded time e.g time of day and time interval e.g. egg timer.
- -To recognise attributes and make comparisons related to measure; weight/length/height e.g heavy/light long/short
- -To develop a number sense through subitising using amounts of 1-3 objects
- -To recognise numbers that are significant to them e.g. 4 or 5 for a birthday, or house number
- -To begin to develop an understanding of the different roles of number
