Nature of support for 2020/21

Our Pupil Premium is being focused on ensuring our most vulnerable pupils catch up with their learning since the opening of the school fully in September 2020 and to ensure these pupils are able to access learning if the school has to close again– the school closed in March 2020 due to Covid 19.

The Pupil Premium is been used mainly to support intervention programmes such as our 1 to 1 programme for pupils in Years 1-6, our Booster programmes for pupils in Years 6 and for extra Teaching Assistant hours in both our Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 classes.

We use some of the PP to support our enrichment activities for pupils identified on the Gifted and Talented list throughout the year. In particular we have used the premium for individual music lesson and PE Clubs.

We use the funding to support our whole school focus on cooking and food technology lessons for every child in our dedicated food technology room.

We use some of the funding to support our whole school focus on gardening and growing in our allotment

We use some of the funding to support the work of our School Councillor.

We also use the funding to support some trip and visits expenditure.
